Anyone who has read the Word of God is sure to recognize Psalms 91:1. He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. The Hebrew word for "abide" in Psalms 91:1 is "luwn" which means to stay permanently. It is also a source of great joy because when you start to enjoy the benefits of God's wings, abiding under God's care, it's only a matter of time before you will be filled with not just happiness, but unspeakable joy because God is protecting you, comforting you, hiding you and giving you His peace. That peace that passes all understanding. The peace that doesn't make sense to the world. The "how you can remain calm and peaceful while your world around you is being turned into utter chaos" kind of peace!!!

We can also obtain great mercy while in the Shadows of His wings.
